

Upon graduating from WPI with a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering in 1987, you began your career at Procter and Gamble in product development. In your first year at Procter and Gamble, you quickly applied for your first of many patent applications. You also gained experience in many functional roles across many categories & progressed your career to group leader before joining Bristol-Myers Squibb. There you helped set up an R&D lab as the section manager of product development.

After two years at Bristol-Myers Squibb, you transitioned your career to Clairol. In your role as associate director, you led different teams across hair, skin care, and deodorant categories in addition to setting up a corporate innovation group. During your time at Clairol, you and your team applied for five additional patent applications across US & Europe. One in particular was for the creation of an ultra-mild clear foaming cleansing system, which had been leveraged in many successful launches.

After almost seven years at Clairol, you moved to The Estee Lauder Companies. As global vice president, you led a highly skilled global product development department to help successfully shape the launch strategies & creative development

of all skin care and make-up launches under the Estee Lauder brand. During the last two years at Estee Lauder, you led an entrepreneurial corporate innovation team, supporting many of the 29 brands with new breakthrough insights, incubation of disruptive technology platforms, novel consumer engagement applications and conceptualization of new business models to help influence a new future. Again, your expertise and creativity led you to apply for five additional patents and release numerous related publications. You spent more than 13 years developing products & innovative platforms for Estee Lauder companies.

You most recently moved to Unilever in 2013, which is ranked No.109 on Forbes Global 2000 listing of the world's biggest public companies.
