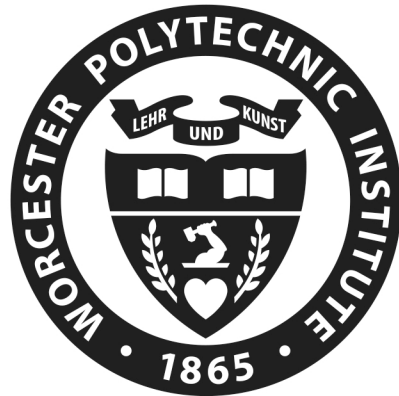

BARI HAMAMI, your dedication to corporate social responsibility has made you stand out in the WPI community. The commitment you have driven for your company is admirable, as you make a difference in the lives of thousands of people every day. You received bachelor's degrees in industrial engineering and manufacturing engineering from WPI. You continued your education at Columbia University, earning a master's degree in industrial engineering in 1995. After working for a few years, you attended the Digging Deep Executive Program at Stanford University's Graduate School of Business.

After graduating from Columbia University, you joined the Management Development Program at Caterpillar Inc., Illinois, USA, where you studied various manufacturing and commercial aspects of the Caterpillar business.

You learned strong business-sense from a young age. Your father began a family business, Trakindo Utama in Indonesia, which was founded in 1970, and you are now the second generation, president director. Today, Trakindo has evolved to become a multi billion-dollar conglomeration and provides one-stop shop solution for the purchase of heavy equipment and machinery for construction, mining, forestry, agricultural, and energy industries. Additionally, the company also offers mining and power systems and engages in coal production, contract mining, integrated logistics, power solutions, and engineering services businesses. Trakindo has received many acknowledgements from the Indonesian government, its customers and its industry partners.

Over the course of more than two decades, you have held several positions throughout the company. You started at

Trakindo in 1997 as an assistant to the general manager, Mining Division, and worked your way up to your current role.

You've made it a priority for Trakindo to be a global leader in humanitarian efforts. You've touched education, health, the environment, and compassionate relief. Trakindo's contributions to education have benefitted more than 13,000 students and 1,000 teachers by creating safe, comfortable learning environments; improving the quality of education through training for teachers; and providing scholarships to deserving students. With your assistance, Trakindo's Pekanbaru branch worked hand-in-hand with the Pekanbaru Public Health and Manpower Agencies to highlight issues relating to HIV/AIDS in the workplace. Your efforts have been recognized with awards from the Ministry of Manpower and Transmigration and the Pekanbaru City Government. You've spearheaded several initiatives to conserve and reuse water where possible and to cleanse and recycle oil from Trakindo industrial workplaces. Trakindo also provides support to disaster victims, such as the 2004 massive Tsunami disaster in Aceh, by mobilizing heavy equipment, donating basic necessities, and helping the local economy get back on its feet.
