

You have been a class agent and Poly Club member supporting WPI athletics. This year you volunteered to chair your 50th Reunion Committee and have led one of the best fundraising efforts from a 50-year reunion class in WPI history. Avid supporters of WPI, you and your wife, Bonnie, also recently established a scholarship to support entrepreneurship at WPI's School of Business. You are also a member of the President's Circle, recognizing leadership annual donors, and you and Bonnie are members of the Alden Society, recognizing those who have made planned gifts to WPI.

A longtime member of the WPI Alumni Association Board, you most recently served as the Association treasurer from 2009 to 2013. In this role, you developed a robust and transparent financial reporting system that meets both internal and external requirements.
