leader. You began your career at Pratt & Whitney, a subsidiary of United Technologies Corporation and a world leader in the design, manufacture, and service of aircraft engines, industrial gas turbines, and space propulsion systems. Starting as a process development engineer, you entered a leadership program

as the youngest member in Pratt & Whitney for this program and you ultimately progressed to director of Strategy & Development, responsible for driving Mergers & Acquisitions, as well, in 2007 for Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Engines.
