You remain behind to wait for Eddie. It is now 11:30am local time and there is still no sign of Eddie

### ***Student Gone Missing: Part Two***

You left a note on Eddie's door asking him to call you the minute he returns to his apartment and have notified IGSD at 11:30 am local time (6:30 am EST) to inform them that Eddie is missing. At approximately 1:00 pm, you are about to begin checking with the local police and hospitals to see if they have any information about Eddie. Your phone rings and it is Eddie, calling you from a local Dominos. You tell him to come to your apartment immediately and when Eddie arrives, he is still reeking of alcohol. Eddie claims that he parted ways with Greg about 6:00 am to go to an ATM to get cash. He is unsure whether Greg was aware that they were no longer together. After going to the ATM, it was about 6:30am local time. Eddie reported that he was still very drunk and he thought it best to try and sober up by riding the local bus around the city. Eddie said he must have fallen asleep on the bus, because he suddenly realized that he has no idea where he was. After wandering around the city, he finally caught a bus and returned to the apartment and called you.

### **Student Gone Missing: Part Three**

You interview all four of the roommates to get further information about their activities on the night in question. These are the written accounts from each of the four roommates:

**Wally Cleaver:** *On Monday evening at roughly 9:45 pm, Eddie Bonsweenie, Richie Cunningham and Greg Mathis decided to go to pubs and I decided to instead catch up on sleep. I was woken up at roughly 12:05 am when Richie returned, saying that he was tired and decided to leave Eddie and Greg. The next morning after my shower I went to Eddie's room, and I discovered that his bed was empty and seemed unused. Then I woke up Richie, and asked him if he knew anything about Eddie, and he did not. After he took his shower, we woke up Greg, asked if he knew anything about Eddie. He answered that he believes Eddie never came home. We looked for him briefly, but had to get to the train station where we informed Prof. Szyzlak.*

**Richie Cunningham:** *I heard someone come back to the apartment sometime after midnight. It sounded like 1 person came back, although it could have been 2, although doubtful since there was no talking when they/he came back. I originally went out with Greg and Eddie, but I left on my own to come back to the apartment 12:30ish, then I went to bed. Everything was fine when I left Greg and Eddie.*

**Greg Mathis:** *Eddie and I were on our way back to the apartments, and we stopped at the bar at the end of the street. We stayed there for a few hours, and had a few drinks while there. It started to get late and we had to get up early so I said we should get back. I don't fully remember if Eddie came back with me, but I wouldn't have left him somewhere alone. I went to sleep, and then he wasn't in the room when we woke up in the morning.*

**Eddie Bonsweenie:** *On 17 March, I failed to attend a language lesson and did not notify my advisor, Professor Szyzlak, in a timely manner. I was out that night with a few others and went to the ATM machine on my way home by myself. I decided to get on a bus and ride that for a while and meet the group at the bus station at 8:00 am. I did not notify anyone of this plan, and had told Greg that I would come back to the apartment after stopping at the ATM. The two main errors here were not doing what I had intended, and also getting on a bus with the plan of meeting the group. I must have fallen asleep briefly, because I suddenly woke up and didn't know where I was. I switched the buses a few times, when I realized that I might not make it to the station on time to meet the group. By around 8:30 am, I knew I had missed the appointment and decided to wander around the city to sober up. Eventually, I found an area that I recognized and caught a bus back to the apartment. When I saw the note on the door from Professor Szyzlak saying to call immediately, I left the apartments to find a phone. I eventually used the phone at Dominos down the street from our apartment.*
