WPI - Summer Housing Contract

Conditions of Contract

Room Assignment

Students who do not occupy their assigned rooms by the first day of the Summer Session, and have not notified the Office of Residential Services prior to Summer Session beginning of their intended late arrival, may be reassigned to a different space at the discretion of the Office of Residential Services. Subletting of your room is not permitted.

A new roommate may be assigned at any time during the summer session when an assigned room has a vacant space.

Room Consolidation

The Office of Residential Services reserves the right to consolidate spaces by changing the room assignment of a student occupying a room with space available.

Room Inspection & Repairs

Residential Services staff reserves the right to enter rooms for the purpose of verifying compliance with health and safety standards, for inventory, and for making necessary repairs to rooms and furnishings.

Room Condition Sheet

All residents are required to sign a Room Condition Sheet upon entering their room in the summer, any time they move to a different room, and when moving out of a room or leaving at the end of the summer. Residents will be responsible for the total repair costs, as determined by Residential Services, as a result of any damage occurring during this period of occupancy, ordinary wear and tear excepted. Students' responsibilities related to their room and common areas are outlined on the back of the Room Condition Sheet.

Guests

A guest is defined as any person not currently listed as living in the particular room. A guest may only stay overnight in a residence hall/house room with permission from all room occupants. A guest may not remain in the residence of the student for more than three consecutive days per month without the consent of the Office of Residential Services.

Rules and Regulations

The student agrees to abide by all the rules and regulations pertaining to WPI housing as outlined in the WPI Guide to Residence Hall Living. Items or behaviors not permitted in WPI housing include, but are not limited to; candles, incense and space-heaters, cooking appliances, illicit drugs/paraphernalia, refrigerators larger than 5 cubic feet, possession/consumption of alcohol by persons under 21, kegs, partial kegs, beer balls or common containers (i.e., punch bowls), firearms, firecrackers, weapons of any kind, misuse of fire safety apparatus, lofts and waterbeds, pets (except for fish), smoking, playing of musical instruments, failure to remove oneself from an environment in which a violation of WPI or Housing policy is occurring.

Failure of a resident or his/her guest to comply with residence hall regulations and policies may lead to imposition of financial liabilities, probation, dismissal from the residence halls and /or WPI, or other civil action. Residents are expected to obey all applicable laws and to respect the rights, privileges and property of other members of the college community and visitors to the campus. Residents are further expected to refrain from actions that materially or substantially interfere with college or residence hall functions, or would endanger the health, safety or welfare of others.

Personal Property

The University will use reasonable efforts to protect a student's property. The University is not in any way liable for the loss of, theft of, or damage to any property belonging to residents. Students are advised to purchase a personal insurance policy if belongings are not covered under family insurance.

Causes beyond the control of the university

The University shall in no event be liable for failure to perform any of its obligations under this contract when prevented from doing so by causes beyond its reasonable control, including without limitations acts of God, acts of war, riots, breakdown, accident, order or regulation of or by any governmental authority.

DIRECTIONS FOR SUMMER HOUSING APPLICATION

Summer housing is available on a limited basis for students taking classes full or part-time, and students working on-campus. All rooms are furnished with a bed, desk, desk chair, wardrobe and dresser per student. There are no cooking facilities available, therefore there is a **required** meal plan for all students in summer housing.

Room Rates

- Housing for E-Term is from May 23-July 11
- E-term Single Room: \$1580 E-term Double Room: \$1467
- Payment must be made to the Accounting Office before keys are issued.
- Housing for students who need to remain on-campus from May 2 to May 22, 2007 is available at the cost of \$600.

Meal Plan - Required

- Starts May 27 and ends July 10 and includes 28 serving days (Monday through Thursday only)
- Meal Plan includes- 28 “all you can eat” meals and \$300 bonus points
- Meal Plan Price- \$610.00
- Students can use bonus dollars to eat breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack in the Campus Center or at the Boynton restaurant on Highland Street. An “all you can eat” buffet dinner meal will be offered in the Campus Center from 5pm-6pm daily.
- The use of the meals included in this plan will end on **July 10**, although the use of bonus points will be allowed until August 24.

PRIORITIES:

Because housing will be limited, we have established the following priorities for housing requests.

- First priority will be for students taking class full-time.
- Second priority will be for part-time students.
- The next priority will be for students working on campus or unable to go home due to distance from Massachusetts.
- If space is available, students working in the Worcester area will then be considered.

APPLICATION:

- Please **complete and return** the attached application to Residential Services **before April 18, 2008**
- You will be notified of your housing assignment by Monday, April 28th

PLEASE NOTE: *It is important to know that once you have signed the summer housing contract, it is binding agreement. Your student account will be billed on Friday, May 2, 2008. If you choose to cancel your accommodations on campus after your room assignment has been finalized and your account has been billed, you may be subject a \$100 housing contract release fee.*
