



Degree/Program	Timeframe	Job Examples
Certificate	High school diploma + 1-2 years of higher education	Legal assistant, secretary, bookkeeper, daycare worker, medical or dental assistant, truck driver
Apprenticeship	High school diploma + 2-3 years of higher education	Electrician, firefighter, stone mason, welder
Associate's Degree	High school diploma + 2 years of higher education	Administrative assistant, engineering technician, human resources specialist, licensed vocational nurse
Bachelor's Degree	High school diploma + 4-6 years of higher education	Architect, cartoonist, writer, teacher, engineer, business project manager, computer programmer, nurse
Master's Degree	High school diploma + 6-8 years of higher education	Hospital administrator, marriage and family counselor, physician's assistant, school principal
Professional Degree	High school diploma + 7-9 years of higher education	Doctor, lawyer, priest/minister, social worker
Doctoral Degree	High school diploma + 8-10 years of higher education	College professor, economist, school superintendent, biomechanical engineer





Gompei the Goat




