Placement Announcements

Your off-campus IQP placements are scheduled to be announced on Tuesday, December 20th. Applicants will receive an email from the Global Projects program notifying them that IQP placements are available on eProjects. You will be able to view your placement on your eProjects dashboard. The placement that you receive is the final decision for this application process. You may not "switch" into a different project center and you cannot move into a different term of a project center. Your only options are to commit or decline your placement.

Committing to a Placement

To commit to a project placement, please complete the Participant Statement of Agreement 2023-2024(PSA) by Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at noon. The agreement form can be found in the [eProjects Forms Library](#). Be sure to choose the correct project center and read the Participant Statement of Agreement thoroughly before signing.

Declining a Placement

If you choose to decline your placement, you may do so using the decline option on the Participant Statement of Agreement 2023-2024 by Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at noon.

Things to Consider When Accepting a Placement

Withdrawal Fees

The decision to withdraw after you have committed may have financial consequences. Please carefully consider our [withdrawal policy](#) prior to commitment. This is especially important for students committing to E23 or A23 Project Centers as you will be charged the full program fee if you choose to withdraw any time after committing.

Program Costs

23-24 Academic Year program cost estimates may be found on the [eProjects](#) program page for each project center. Costs are estimated up to

a year in advance and unexpected increases do occur. We will do our best to inform students of increases over \$200.

[WPI Global Scholar Scholarship](#)

The scholarship will come in the form of a credit that will appear on your bill for the academic period in which you will be conducting project work, and will defray direct, billable costs (housing and program fees). It will also include up to \$1,500 to be applied toward indirect costs (flights, food, and incidentals). Visit the [Scholarships](#) page for more information.

[ID2050 and PQP](#)

Participation in the program will require enrollment in, and successful completion of the preparation course (1/3 unit, ID2050) and pre-qualifying project (1/6 unit, PQP) conducted in the term before you go away. The preparation courses (ID2050 and PQP) for an off-campus project are time-consuming and rigorous. Students are prohibited from overloading in the preparation term. Leave room in your schedule for ID2050 on Monday and Thursday evenings from 6:30 – 8:20. GEO staff will register you for ID2050 once you have committed and you will register for PQP and IQP with your team at the beginning of your prep term.

IQP preparations may start as early as two terms prior to your off-campus experience. Please read the details of these requirements carefully and consider the commitment in relation to your other course commitments for your pre-prep term. These details are posted on the site specific program pages on eprojects.wpi.edu. Project centers with a pre-prep are listed in the blue square below.

Academic Standing

It is important that you maintain good academic standing leading up to your prep and project terms. As a reminder, Academic Probation will prevent students from receiving financial aid, will result in a loss of eligibility for team sports, will prevent the student from obtaining undergraduate employment in the Co-op Program and will prevent participation in the Global Projects Program.

Final Notes

This year, a record number of students have completed applications for off-campus IQP project centers for the 2023-2024 academic year. We have been very busy reviewing almost 1200 applications, and we have worked hard to place this record number of applicants into top-choice project centers. We have added new sites in Cadiz, Spain and White Mountains, New Hampshire, and expanded project center capacities in New Zealand, Australia, London, and other sites to meet the growing need. We are expecting to place over 96% of applicants in an off-campus IQP, 90% in one of their top choice sites.

Each year there a number of students will not be placed in an off-campus project center in the initial application process. If you were not placed in this process, you still have options available for completing an IQP in the 2023-2024 academic year. You are welcome to re-apply to the Global Projects Program in late January, April, July or September. Some students prefer an on-campus IQP. GEO staff are happy to discuss IQP options that are right for you.
