LIEUTENANT GENERAL DOUGLAS A. SIMS II DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, J-3, THE JOINT STAFF



LTG Douglas A. Sims II is currently the Director for Operations, Joint Staff, at the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia, and assists the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in developing and providing operational guidance, and in fostering clear communication between the President, Secretary of Defense, unified commands, and services.

Prior to his current assignment, he was the Commanding General of the 1st Infantry Division, "The Big Red One", and of Fort Riley, Kansas. His assignments include service as an airborne, Ranger, and Stryker infantryman in the 82d

Airborne Division, the 2d Ranger Battalion, the 501st Parachute Infantry Regiment, the 25th Infantry Division, U.S. Special Operations Command, the 2d Cavalry Regiment, the 4th Infantry Division, the Army and Joint Staffs. He commanded at the squadron and regimental levels in the 2d Cavalry Regiment. He has served in Operations Freedom's Sentinel, Enduring Freedom, and Iraqi Freedom.

LTG Sims received his commission through United States Military Academy in June 1991. His military education includes the Infantry Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, United States Army Command and General Staff College, Joint and Combined Warfighting School and the Senior Service College Fellowship - Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

His awards and decorations include the Army Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit (with 1 Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster), Bronze Star Medal (with 2 Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (with 4 Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Commendation Medal (with 3 Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Achievement Medal (with Silver Oak Leaf Cluster), Combat Infantryman Badge, Expert Infantryman Badge, Master Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Ranger Tab, Pathfinder Badge, Army Staff Identification Badge.
