- iii. Literature and writing rhetoric (EN, WR, RH);
- iv. History and international studies (HI, HU, INTL);
- v. Philosophy and religion (PY, RE).

Law Concentration = GOV 1310, GOV 2310, GOV 2311, GOV 2313, GOV 2314, GOV 2315, GOV 2320, plus one or two GOV elective courses if GOV 1310 and/or GOV 2310 are taken as core courses.

Note 4: Other courses in the SSPS Department can also be taken to complete the STP major. Students should review courses with the following prefixes: DEV, ECON, ENV, PSY, SD, SOC, SS, and STS.
