FOCUS ON MQP

Whether or not you participate in the Global Projects Program, all students must complete an MQP to graduate. The MQP projects are in a students' major field of study and are usually undertaken in a student's senior year.

Students may choose to complete the MQP requirement off campus through the Global Projects Program. This option is a 1 term project, advised by faculty

in the student's major department.

Now is the time think about what kind of MQP experience you hope to have. Do you want to do an off-campus or on-campus MQP? Where will MQP fit in your schedule?

EXPLORE YOUR OPTIONS

Visit <u>eProjects.wpi.edu</u> to start your project center search. Filter by your major to find an MQP that is accepting students in your field of study.

Browse Program Opportunities, watch project center videos, and read details regarding housing, transportation, climate, medical care, and travel risks.

Look at what type of projects have been completed at the Project Center.

Consider any personal health concerns (allergies, chronic conditions) that could impact where you travel based on climate and/or environmental factors.

Make sure to take any dietary restrictions (gluten intolerance, lactose intolerance etc.) or allergies (nuts in particular) into account as you consider potential IQP sites. Consulting with the Global Experience Office about any health concerns in advance of your application will help you to make a more informed decision about whether a particular site is right for you.

Determine which term(s) you can feasibly go away.

Know what price range you are looking at for this experience. Discuss cost with your family.

PROGRAM BILLING

Students will be billed the following fees by WPI for the WPI semester they are away.

- · WPI Tuition and Fees
- · WPI Housing Fee (if applicable)
- · WPI Meal Plan (if applicable, reduced for term away)
- · Global Projects Program Housing and Program Fee (for applicable programs)

In addition to this, students should budget for the following while away:

- · Local transportation
- · Airfare (if applicable)
- · Food
- · Tourist activities and incidentals
- · Project related incidentals

GLOBAL SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship will come in the form of a credit that will appear on your bill for the academic period in which you'll be conducting project work, and is awarded to defray direct, billable costs (housing and program fees). Additional scholarship information can be found on the Global Scholarship page of the WPI website.

THE MQP APPLICATION

Sophomores and upperclassmen are eligible to apply to the Global Projects Program for MQP. Although if you are a sophomore, we recommend waiting until your Junior year to apply. Students on academic warning are eligible to apply but should carefully consider the rigor of the program and speak with someone in Academic Advising about your specific situation.

The admission process considers the balance of background and skills, academic record, and other characteristics necessary to provide eligible students a high quality experience at individual sites. If not selected for your first choice project center, your application will be moved to your second choice, third choice, etc. until you are placed or out of options. No student is guaranteed placement at any project center

Remember: Only rank project center(s) which offer an MQP for your major. Visit each eProjects page to confirm major eligibility.

To Apply: Click the APPLY NOW button on any eProjects MQP program page.

BUDGETING FOR TRAVEL

Program costs are posted on the eProjects program page for each project center. Housing and Program Fee cost estimates are calculated one year in advance of the program's dates. Unexpected increases do occur. See the billing schedule in the gray box left.

Program costs for participating in the Global Projects MQP Program range from \$0 to \$9,100. More than 50% of our sites are less than \$5,500, and many sites fall between \$3-4,000. We encourage you to talk with parents or anyone who may be financially supporting you to discuss program costs and budgeting. If you have questions regarding the use of your Global Scholarship, please contact the Office of Financial Aid.

While traveling for your project, you will still be responsible for paying for your on-campus housing. If you have questions about housing please contact the <u>Office of Residential Services</u>.
