Diversity Science Concentration

Concentration Guidelines:

1. Psychological Science Majors who are interested in psychological study of diversity can choose to complete a concentration in Diversity Science. To complete the concentration, students must complete 2 units of coursework from the approved list of courses related to diversity, equity, and inclusion.
2. All students completing this concentration will need to complete an MQP that relates to Diversity Science.
3. 5/3 units should come from Psychological Science and may include (see Note 1):
 - PSY 2401: Psychology of Education
 - PSY 2404: Developmental Psychology
 - PSY 2406: Cross-Cultural Psychology: Human Behavior in Global Perspective
 - PSY 2412: Mental Health
 - PSY 3000: Psychology and Law
 - PSY 3407: Psychology of Gender
 - PSY 3408: Health Psychology
 - PSY 3504: Human Sexuality
 - PSY 4120: School Psychology
 - PSY 2999, 3999, or 4999: Research in Psych Science
 - PSY 1800, 2800, 3800, 4800: Diversity Science Related Topics
 - a. Note 1: Only one course in this subset can be at the 1000-level.
 - b. You cannot get credit for PSY 2408 and PSY 3408. Starting 2024-2025, PSY 2408 will no longer be offered and PSY 3408 will be offered.

1. Psychological Science Majors who are interested in the biological aspects of psychology can choose to complete a concentration in Psychobiology. To complete the concentration, students must complete 2 units of coursework from the approved list of courses related to psychobiology.
2. All students completing this concentration will need to complete an MQP that relates to psychobiology.
3. 2/3 units should come from the Psychological Science and may include (see Note 1):
 - PSY 2404: Developmental Psychology
 - PSY 2412: Mental Health
 - PSY 3408: Health Psychology
 - PSY 3504: Human Sexuality
 - PSY 4110: Psychophysiology
 - a. Note 1: Only one course in this subset can be at the 1000-level
 - b. Note: You cannot get credit for PSY 2502 and PSY 4110. Starting 2021-2022, PSY 2502 will no longer be offered and PSY 4110 will be offered. You cannot get credit for PSY 2408 and PSY 3408. Starting 2024-2025, PSY 2408 will no longer be offered and PSY 3408 will be offered.
