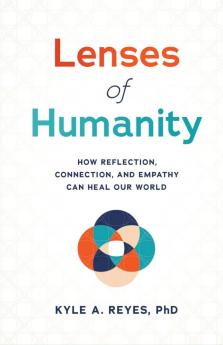

Keynote Speaker: Dr. Kyle Reyes

Dr. Kyle A. Reyes currently serves as vice president of institutional advancement at Utah Valley University (UVU). From 2017-2022, Dr. Reyes served as vice president of student affairs and from 2014-2017, he served as UVU's senior diversity officer and led the development and implementation of UVU's nationally recognized Strategic Inclusion and Diversity Plan, which consisted of nearly 40 initiatives focused on making UVU a more inclusive campus. He has been at UVU for nearly 21 years in various offices and programs: TRIO Upward Bound, GEAR UP, Multicultural Student Services, Student Success & Retention, the School of Education, and the Office of the President.

Dr. Reyes is also a tenured associate professor of education at UVU and taught courses in multicultural education, family & community partnerships, and arts-integrated teaching. His research focuses on arts-based student empowerment; leadership for equity and access; intercultural relationships; and institution-wide inclusion and diversity strategic planning. His book, *Lenses of Humanity: How Reflection, Connection, and Empathy Can Heal Our World*, was published by Green Leaf Book Group in October 2024.

Dr. Reyes has consulted with, and presented to, organizations in 35 states and Canada in various sectors including K-12 education, higher education, business, community task forces, and faith groups. He has given more than 750 presentations over the past 19 years on issues of diversity, inclusion, art, cultural competence, voice, identity, multiculturalism, and leadership.

Dr. Reyes serves on the national board of Asian Pacific Americans in Higher Education as well as the Utah Governor's Multicultural Commission. He is the past president of the Utah chapter of the National Association for Multicultural Education. Dr. Reyes has also served as the cochair of the College Access Network for the Utah System of Higher Education and a member of the board of directors for the United Way of Utah County and American Indian Services.

Dr. Reyes has received a number of awards including: UVU's Board of Trustees Award; the Exemplary Educator for Diversity Award from the National Association of Multicultural Education (NAME); Inclusion Cultivates Excellence Award from College and University Professional Association for Human Resources; *Utah Valley Magazine* Top 40 Under 40; and the top 50 Diversity Executives in the Nation from *Diversity MBA* magazine.

Dr. Reyes received his PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy from the University of Utah and was the recipient of the Bennion Morgan Fellowship.
