## Overview

Mimi Sheller, Ph.D., is an internationally recognized distinguished scholar and higher education leader, with twenty years of experience in executive leadership. She is the former Inaugural Dean of the Global School and Professor in the Department of Integrative and Global Studies at Worcester Polytechnic Institute. She was Professor of Sociology, Head of the Sociology Department, and founding Director of the Center for Mobilities Research and Policy at Drexel University in Philadelphia (2009-2021). She served as President of the International Association for the History of Transport, Traffic and Mobility (2014-2017). She has published more than 180 articles and book chapters and is the author or co-editor of fifteen books. She was awarded Honorary Doctorates from Aalborg University (2026) and from Roskilde University, (2015). She is currently a PI and Co-PI for two research grants from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration as part of the Caribbean Collaborative Action Network, a NOAA Climate Adaptation Program team.
