Who We Are

In October 2016, WPI entered into a partnership with Tsinghua University in Beijing—one that aims to make the world safer. The cooperation agreement was signed by WPI President Laurie Leshin and Tsinghua President Qiu Yong to develop a joint academic and research center focused on global public safety concerns related to man-made and natural disasters, such as earthquakes, floods, and fires. Both universities have been working to increase disaster prevention and safety practices around the world. Together, with this new endeavor, they aim to be the leaders in creating a more resilient world.

At WPI, the Center for Global Public Safety is an interdisciplinary research and innovation initiative that brings together industry leaders and universities from around the world to lead an integrated effort to improve global public safety. Academic and industry partnerships are developing solutions to local and global problems while advancing essential technology for the development of smart and safe communities worldwide.

The mission of the Center for Global Public Safety is to engage in research, education, strategic alliances and outreach activities that make the world a safer place. Our focus areas include: fire protection, water security, energy initiatives, emergency response, and smart transportation technologies.

Driven by a vision to develop local and global solutions to challenges in these areas, our demand-driven center activities engage people in world-class research, education, strategic partnerships, and innovation to solve real world problems.

What We Can Achieve

We aim to reach higher and achieve a new level of impact in public safety by preparing our graduates to be global citizens and enable our students and faculty to have a positive impact on the world. We also know that as our global society becomes increasingly complex and inter-connected, so too do the challenges we face.

This is especially true in the realm of public safety. The evolution of our modern urban environments presents numerous and developing threats to our public safety from both natural and human-made causes. Disasters by their nature are complex interdisciplinary problems that cut across jurisdictional and geographic boundaries. Effective disaster response, therefore, requires innovative thinkers who can work across cultures and disciplines quickly and decisively, when lives and livelihoods are at stake.

It is truly a different world than event a decade ago. WPI, with its well-established and internationally respected academic and research programs, has redoubled its commitment to improving our resiliency to the broad range of global public safety concerns.

Within five years, the Center for Global Public Safety aims to have established a global network in five locations that is delivering impactful results in public safety for communities around the world—Worcester, MA (USA); Beijing (China); United Arab Emirates; Africa; and South America.

How We Will Get There

Education: Training, certificate, and degree programs offered through WPI and other partner institutions such as Tsinghua University enable students greater opportunities to gain expertise in areas related to global public safety, including fire protection engineering, water security, energy initiatives, first responder technologies, and advancements in smart transportation.

Partnerships with universities around the world give students the opportunity to study with affiliated institutions and participate in student exchange programs. Our programs are expanding to include partners in the Middle East and beyond.

Value of Being a Philanthropic Supporter


Philanthropic supporters of the Center for Global Public Safety become part of a network of professionals dedicated to creating positive change in the world. Our supporters:
