



### **Bio of Meng Bo**

Meng Bo is the Associate Dean of the Office of International Affairs at Tsinghua University since 2016, responsible for strategic initiatives and overseas study. She is a member of the Board of Trustees at Tsinghua South East Asia Center.

Before joined Tsinghua International Office, she worked at the School of Public Policy and Management since 2000. As a senior administrator, she led the School's international office since 2002, and served as the associate dean for development and international cooperation since 2013. She worked with international partners on joint research projects, faculty and student exchange, executive education and other key international programs. She oversaw the operation of Master of Public Administration in International Development – MID since 2007, China's first international development master program taught in English, and brought it into the global network of MDP in 2009. She also oversaw the International Master of Public Administration-IMPA, China's first one-year master program for international mid-career practitioners. She led the joint executive training programs between Harvard Kennedy School and SPPM since 2002. She was the deputy director of Brookings-Tsinghua Center, Brookings's first overseas joint center. In July 2013, she played a key role in the success of the MPA program of SPPM applying for NASPAA accreditation, the first public affairs program outside the US receiving this accreditation.

She serves as a member in the Commission on Peer Review and Accreditation (COPRA, 2017-2020) and Executive Council (2018-2021) for the Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs, and Administration (NASPAA based in DC, US).

She is a Doctor of Education (Ed.D) candidate in the Institute of Education, Tsinghua University. She holds MPA degree from Seattle University, USA, and B.A. degree in Diplomacy from Foreign Affairs University in China.
