She also chairs the Steering Group which developed and recently launched the National Action Plan for Community Governance and will oversee its implementation. Recent governance appointments include being the Chair of Massey University's Pacific Student Success Working Group, and chair of the Pasifika Education Centre in Auckland. In January 2019, Mele was awarded a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit (MNZM) for her services to governance, the Pacific community and women.
