Teaching Practicum

- Can count as an IQP
- Must happen either A/B or C/D of junior year
- When completing practicum, cannot take courses before 2pm at WPI
- During the first term of the practicum, students may take up to 2 courses
- During the second term of the practicum, students may take no more than 1 course
- A practicum seminar meets twice a week (1 hour and 1.5 hours) throughout the practicum
- Student teachers operate off of their school's schedule not the WPI schedule
- Students must take teaching tests (MTELs) and complete a CORI check and finger printing before starting at their school

Senior Seminar

- Meets 4 times throughout the academic year for 2-3 hours
- Focuses on topics that have not been previously covered in depth (ex: Technology and Assessments)

Graduate with...

- A Massachusetts Initial Teaching License (transferable to other states) in either:
 - o Middle or High School Math
 - High School Biology
 - High School Physics
 - High Schools Chemistry
 - Middle School Science*
 - Middle and High School technology/Engineering*

Additional Program Requirements

- Take the MTEL exam in the content area you wish to teach in and in communication and literacy prior to the teaching practicum.
- Complete a PQP (during the first semester of the practicum).

Characteristics of Success

- Teachers are strong leaders who know how to set high expectations for both behavior and academics while also being sympathetic and understanding of the students in front of them.
- Teachers are strong relationship builders who are very respectful and appreciative of diversity in every sense.
- Teachers work hard to motivate others.
- Teachers work hard to persevere even in the face of challenges.
- Teachers are organized, critical thinkers who often try to think outside of the box.
- Teachers are excellent communicators.
- Teachers work well in both teams as well as independently.
